How much is your time worth? Can you put a dollar amount on your time or is there some variance in how you would value your time? I look at value a lot like perception....it is different for each individual. While a price or a dollar amount can be universally accepted by all, the value is independent for everyone. For example, a car may cost \$20,000, you and I can agree on that amount; however for someone who makes \$25,000 a year, the value of the car is much different than another individual who earns \$250,000 a year. Same price, much different value.

The difference I see with time and money in determining value is that we each get equal amounts of time each day, but the amount of money we earn varies. While you know you have 24 hours in a day just like everyone else, how are you going to use this time to maximize your value? As M. Scott Peck alluded, the first step in maximizing your time is to "value yourself". Until your perception of yourself is that of someone who makes a difference, you likely will not begin to make a difference. You decide when you are ready to make a difference and start adding value to your time.

Although you have an equal number of hours in each day as everyone else, remember the number of days for everyone is no guarantee. Every day is precious and should be highly valued. There is no reason to waste another day. What is it is you could do this week to bring more value to yourself? And once you begin starting and accomplishing goals, you will find much greater value in yourself, and your time!
